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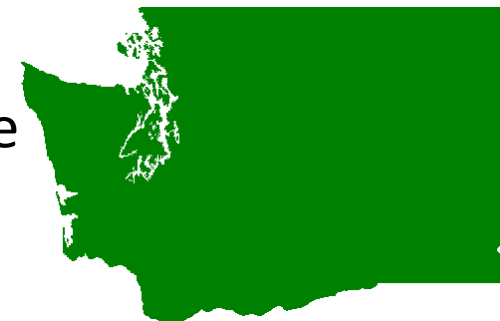
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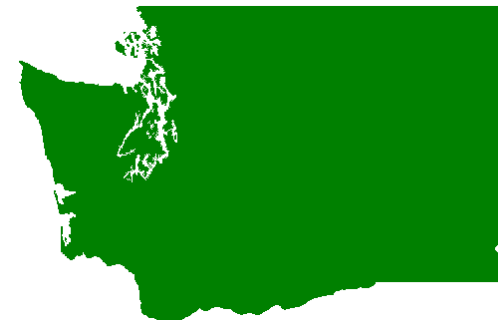


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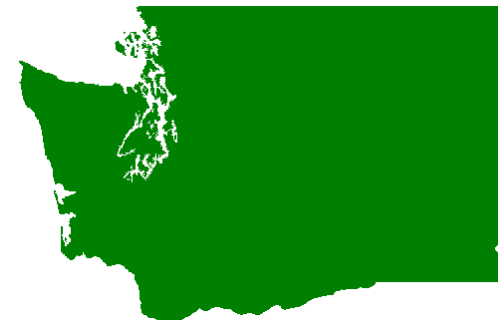
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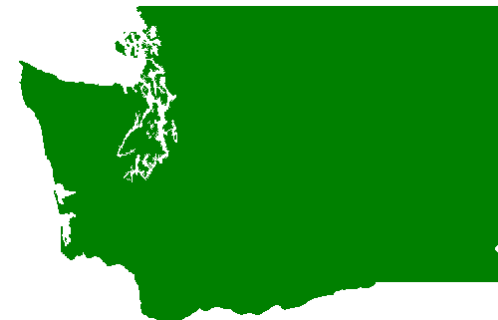
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The Internet

The ICAC Task Force



- **ICAC Task Force concept launched in 1998 with 10 regional task forces**
- **Protect Our Children Act of 2008 officially established the National Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program**
- **Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Programs (OJJDP) oversees the program**
- **Dedicated to developing effective responses to:**
 - **child exploitation** **child pornography**
 - **child obscenity** **online enticement of children**
 - **child sex trafficking** **production CSE images/video**



The Problem



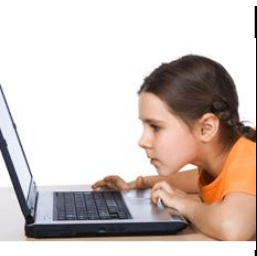
- **The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children is the entity for CT reporting and CT distribution.**
- **In all of 2014 NCMEC received over 1.1 million CT reports (2013 there were 600,000 up from 300,00 in 2012). 2015 was over 4 million reports and by 2017 the number exceeded 10 million.**



The Problem



- **Not only images but “hands-on” victims**
- **One out of 3 girls and 1 out of 5 boys are sexually assaulted before age 18**
- **Scope of child exploitation is global**
- **Evolving technology, encryption, and anonymity are obstacles to investigations**
- **We are constantly training, purchasing new equipment, exchanging information, developing new techniques, whatever it takes to stay on top of the every evolving landscape**



The Problem

- **NCMEC reports that stats show the following breakdown in CP production:**
 - **15% Self-Produced (Self-Exploitation)**
 - **19% Online Enticement**
 - **16% Parent/Guardian**
 - **26% Family/Friend**
- **When you place these percentages in light of the numbers we are at epidemic proportions**

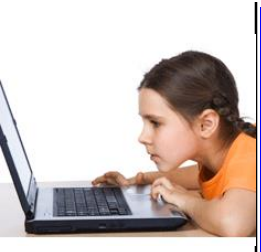

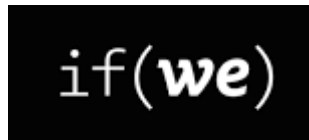

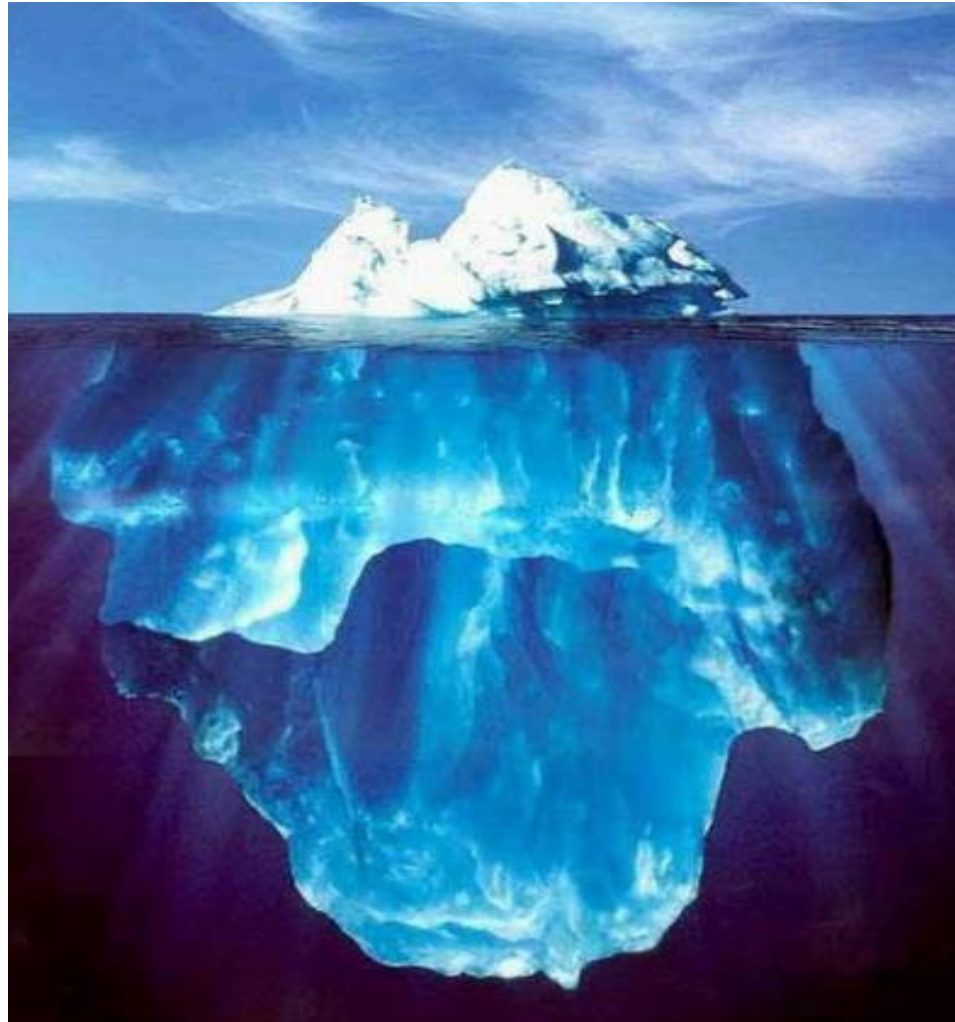

The Cases





The Vice Principal



- **February 2016 WA ICAC TF Arrest**
Vice Principal Nathan Piturachsattit
from Coulee City
- **The case was a referral from Wisconsin**
- **The suspect had been exchanging images and videos of nudity and masturbation with a 14 year old victim.**
- **The suspect had sent the victim a gift.**
- **The suspect admitted to his involvement with the 14 year old victim but denied any other actions against other children.**
- **Stated in his interview and court documents that he was addicted to online pornography – he used KIK to find his victim.....**





We go looking for them



- We search the internet for active predators that are either collecting, trading or exchanging child pornography
- We conduct “sting” operations where we seek out predators who want to have sex with children
- Unfortunately far too often they are easy to find and there are a lot of them



The Army Ranger



- In October 2014 Seattle ICAC detective posted an online ad stating she had a 13-year-old daughter and was looking for a friend.
- Within less than 30 minutes there were over 30 responses inquiring about the daughter.
- The detective entered into an online discussion with one of the men who responded. A meeting was set up to discuss details where the suspect requested to have sex with the daughter.
- A second meeting was arranged where the suspect believed he would be having sex with a 13-year-old girl but instead was arrested by members of the WA ICAC TF.
- Suspect was a former Army Ranger and current student at UW.



Texting on a Plane



A preschool teacher from Seattle, WA on a flight to San Jose, CA was startled to see a passenger texting about a plan to abuse children. She acted quickly and took pictures of the suspects cell phone messages. She alerted the flight crew and local police were advised. Upon landing she and a flight attendant identified the male suspect to the officer (a former ICAC investigator) who arrested him and recovered his phone. The San Jose ICAC reached out to the WA ICAC TF for assistance as the female primary suspect lived in the Tacoma area. The WA ICAC TF acted quickly when it was discovered that she indeed had access to children, locating her and arresting her. Both suspects have been indicted federally and are awaiting additional state charges to be filed against them.

Spokane Man Sentenced to 21 Years for Production of Child Pornography

Freedom Woody, age 22, of Spokane, Washington, was sentenced today after having pleaded guilty on February 21, 2018 to production of child pornography...to a 21-year term of imprisonment, to be followed by a 30-year term of court supervision after he is released from federal prison.

Have the conversation



- It's up to us to explain to our kids not only why it's wrong to send pictures of themselves but also the consequences.

- You don't have to look far to find them, and guess what, in the case of celebrities they were using the very same apps that your kids have or have heard about.....
- Have the conversation....NOW!



Be the PARENT



- **Too many easy alternatives exist to give us excuses to not parent our kids**
 - **Drop them off at practice or the social event – they have adults there to watch them right?**
- **Kids are influenced by their peers and who they see as role models in the entertainment industries...music, movies, internet**
 - **Do you promote them right along with your kids?**
- **Remember what you were like as a kid?**
 - **Why do we expect so much more from our kids when we know what we and those around us were like?**

Apps can't protect you



As multiple reports stated, it's very possible that some of the stolen images belong to underage victims since 50 percent of Snapchat's users are between the ages of 13 and 17.
